2023 Annual Implementation Plan

APPRENTICESHIPS AND TRAINEESHIPS

Head Start supports students undertaking School Based Apprenticeships/Traineeships (SBATs). Students undertaking a SBAT attend Hallam Secondary College part time, work part time and attend TAFE Training. Mentoring and monitoring is given to students throughout their SBAT guiding them towards full time work once they have completed their secondary education.

I have been meeting with some Hallam Secondary students which has been a great experience so far. I am keen to keep meeting with and speak with more enthusiastic Year II and I2 students who are considering entering into an Apprenticeship whilst they are completing their senior studies at Hallam Secondary College.

Many industries are experiencing a skills shortage – therefore Employers are wanting to engage with the Head Start team to employ a School Based Apprentice/Trainee in their business.

Year 7 NAPLAN Tests - 2023

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) for Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 students are held in March each year.

In 2023, our Year 7 students will take the NAPLAN tests between Wednesday 15 March and Monday 27 March.

NAPLAN tests assess student knowledge and skills in writing, reading, conventions of language (Spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The results of the tests provide information for students, parents, teachers and principals and can be used to improve student achievement.

NAPLAN tests are delivered in an online format. This delivers many benefits including:

- A 'tailored test' design that adapts to correct and incorrect student responses providing a more precise understanding of student achievement;
- Innovative use of technology, including a more engaging test design and a wider range of item types;
- An extended and more flexible test window, allowing schools greater opportunity to schedule the tests at times that suit them best and increasing student participation.

All eligible students are expected to participate in the NAPLAN tests. Catch up tests will be available for individual students who are absent on test days up to and including Monday 27 March 2023.

Support will be arranged for students who regularly uses similar supports for classroom assessment tasks.

Exemptions may be granted to students with significant intellectual disabilities and to students who have been learning English for less than one year. If your child is eligible for support due to disability or exemption, you should discuss this with their teacher prior to the tests. Parental consent is required before any support due to disability or exemption is granted.

Students may be withdrawn from NAPLAN by their parent or carer. This is a matter for consideration by parents and carers in consultation with the principal. If, after consultation, you decide to withdraw your child, you must sign a student withdrawal form. These forms are available at the school.

Later in the year you will receive your child's personal NAPLAN report. The report will describe your child's particular skills in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The report will also show how your child performed in relation to national minimum standards. These describe the minimum acceptable standards for students across Australia.

The information you receive as a result of your child's participation in the NAPLAN tests will be valuable in helping you to assess your child's progress in literacy and numeracy.

Round 6 of the Get Active Kids Voucher Program is now open!

We're excited to announce that applications for Round 6 of the Get Active Kids Voucher Program are now open!

If your family or child has a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, you may be eligible for up to \$200 to put towards the cost of your child's participation in sport and active recreation activities.

The Get Active Kids Voucher Program helps eligible families get their kids involved in organised sport and active recreation activities by providing financial support for the cost of membership and registration fees. Eligible children may be able to receive up to \$200 each.

Special consideration also applies for children residing in care services, as well as temporary or provisional visa holders, undocumented migrants, or international students.
