Wednesday 23rd August Curriculum Day - No school Tuesday 29th August Carer/Parent Teacher Interviews With all the pressure on our Year 12 students, we continue to ensure every student is being supported both academically and emotionally.

As our Year 12 students can see the light at the end of the tunnel, we are preparing for our new cohort of Year 7 students to join us in 2024. I am pleased to report that 100 families have been offered a place in Year 7 next year – a sign that the community has faith in our approach.

For our Year 10 and 11 students the last two weeks have seen them making important choices about their future. We have been course counselling our Year 10s and 11s and they have now selected their VCE subjects for 2024. Our students are now embracing the more academic focus that the College has implemented.

In the coming weeks we will be enrolling students into Year 10 for next year.

With all this hard work taking place we haven't lost sight of how important it is to have fun at school.

On Monday we held our Athletics Day at Casey Fields. Our students and staff really enjoyed the day with great sporting performances, a steady supply of 'snags' and the best weather for weeks. Many of the students who competing will now go on to take part in District and Regional sports competition.

This was our second major whole-school sporting event for the year following our highly successful Swimming Carnival in February.

Finally, a reminder that on Wednesday 23rd August we have our last Student Free Day for the year. The focus for all our Student Free Days this year and into 2024 is on Responsive Teaching and the Science of Learning. This approach to Teaching and Learning follows the very latest evidence on how people learn and is being led by one of Australia's foremost experts in the field – Bronwyn Ryrie-Jones.

Building Project

This week we signed off on the Schematic Design stage of the new building project. The next stage will be to go out to tender to contract a builder for the works. We are looking at a 2025 start and finish for the works.

The Government commitment of \$24.2 million will bring us a new Gymnasium, new Administrative and Resource Centre and a Junior Years Learning Centre.

The Australian Curriculum has been reviewed and updated. In response to these changes the VCAA has been working on the Victorian Curriculum 2.0. The overall objectives can be seen below.

The VCAA is developing the Victorian Curriculum F–10 Version 2.0 to incorporate content from the Australian Curriculum Version 9.0 and to refine the overall design and content to make it easier for teachers to implement efficiently and effectively. Building on the success of the current Victorian Curriculum F–10, the revisions will:

Teaching and Learning at Hallam Secondary College.

This term has started with our parent information session and Course Counselling interviews for our Year 10 and 11 students. There was a significant amount of preparation completed with the students through Careers Programs, Assemblies and the ACE Homegroup program.

We hope that now each student has a pathway that is appropriate to their future plans and the direction that they want their life to take.

It is important for both families and students to understand the importance of effort and satisfactory outcomes as students move into a Year 11 or 12 Program. The VCAA stipulates that in either Victorian Certificate of Education (with and ATAR or Vocational Major) each student MUST achieve a minimum of 16 credits over the 3 year period (Year 10, 11 and 12). This is achievable for each and every one of our students as they will be in enrolled in 22 credits over the 3 years.

In order to achieve success across a senior program the most important thing is consistency in effort and attendance. Being at school every day and in classes is they was to get the best outcome for you.

Interim reports will be released and Essential Learning Task data will also be entered on to compass by mid-August. Please keep your eye out for this information to assist you in tracking your student's progress. You will also be able to book in a Parent Teacher Interview on Tuesday 29th of August to discuss this progress with the classroom teacher. Our partnership as a school and families with students is a strength of our college and so important in getting the best out of education for our students. If you need support in booking or an interpreter please contact the college office.

For our Year 7 families you will shortly be receiving your detailed NAPLAN results. If you have any concerns about your students results or need help unpacking them, please do not hesitate to speak with their English or Maths teachers.

We have a tiered response to intervention for all our students based on our student data, we will use the NAPLAN data as part of this information to ensure that an appropriate level of support is in place for all of our students.
